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Pompa Files for Texas Senate District 10

Conservative candidate attracts new supporters from across the district

ARLINGTON, TEXAS – Conservative Tony Pompa officially filed for the Republican nomination to Texas Senate District 10, this week.

“After so many months of campaigning it was great to make it all official,” said Pompa once he had filed his official paperwork with the Tarrant County Republican Party. “The outpouring of support and all the new endorsements I’ve received is energizing to say the least. Hopping on board Team Pompa this week from the Arlington City Council are Sheri Capehart and Kathryn Wilemon. They join Arlington Mayor Robert Cluck and Councilwoman Lana Wolff in their support of Pompa’s candidacy.

Also endorsing today are local leaders Vince Puente, who serves as President of Sales & Marketing at Southwest Office Systems, Victor Vandergriff, current Commissioner at TxDOT, and Neal Adams, a local attorney and stalwart of the Republican Party in Tarrant County.

“Like a lot of Republicans in our community, I am interested in winning this critical race and electing someone who’ll strongly represent our conservative values in Austin. Tony Pompa is the candidate who gives us the best chance to achieve these goals,” offered Adams.
