BUTTON ANNOUNCES FOR RE-ELECTION

State Representative Angie Chen Button today announced she will run for re-election to her Texas State House seat. A rising conservative star in the Texas Legislature, Rep. Button is currently a member of the Ways and Means Committee, Calendars Committee and is Vice-Chair of the Technology Committee. She has represented the North Dallas County area since 2009.

"I am running for re-election to continue my fight to make Texas the best place to live, work, and raise a family," said Button. "Now is the time to send strong leadership to Austin to fight for our children and the future of Texas."

In the legislature, Button has opposed all tax increases. Texas' strong stand against tax increases has been one of the key reasons it was one of the last states to succumb to the recession and the first one to recover from it.
